#### **AM RADIO WONDER**

Pre-British invasion era, Dion Francis DiMucci, aka Dion, was one of the most popular American rock 'n roll performers with over a dozen top 40 hits in late 50's and early 60's.

Born July 18, 1939 in the Bronx, he followed his vaudeville entertainer father on tour and developed a passion for country music, particularly Hank Williams.

He honed his own musical talents on the street corners creating a cappela groups. In 1957 he signed a record deal in which *The Chosen Few* was released. The producers later signed Dion's friends, the Belmonts, named for their close proximity to Belmont Avenue; they recorded *I Wonder Why, No One Knows Me* and *Don't Pity Me*, all which charted.

The group was solicited to play The Winter Dance Party with Richie Valens, Buddy Holly, etc. Fortunately, Dion couldn't afford the \$36 airfare which spared his life.

A Teenager In Love and Where or When were released in 59 and vaulted to the top of the charts. Soon after this success Dion checked himself into a hospital for heroin abuse, an addiction since his mid-teens. This addition also led to the breakup of the Belmonts.

He soloed the first half of the 60's garnering tremendous success with *Lonely Teenager, Runaround Sue* (gold disc), *The Wanderer* and *Lovers Who Wander.* 

In the latter part of the 60's his career declined as he incorporated blues into his music and didn't succeed commercially.

In 68 he had a powerful religious experience, became "clean" again and approached a record company for a contract. Reluctantly, they agreed with the proviso he record *Abraham, Martin and John.* This song was an overwhelming success and earned him a gold disc

In the 70's as a born again Christian his music reflected his spirit; he won a Dove Award and was nominated for a Grammy as best male gospel singer.

He was inducted into the Hall of Fame and currently pursues prison ministry reaching out to men going through addition recovery.
